There were 73 people in attendance, which included RCAFA members from 429 and 441 Wings, family members, and friends from the local community. The Service was led by our Wing Padre, Rev Doug Crocker. It started off with the 'Missing Aviator Ceremony' and then poppies were placed on the wreath in memory of Bob. Eulogies were provided by Kris Foley, Mike McSorley, Murray Conley, Sam Newman, and Everett Horner. They talked about the impact Bob had on their lives, and his wideranging interests and activities. During his 37 years as a member of our Wing, Bob provided outstanding leadership as its President and as a Director. When required, Bob took on many other roles and duties, including being a key organizer of the 2017 RCAFA Ontario Group AGM in Orillia. The Wing Colour Guard added to the pomp and pageantry of the celebration, which included the folding up the RCAF Ensign and presenting it to the Jane at the end of the ceremony. Afterward, those present enjoyed coffee, tea, pop, juice and some light snacks while socializing with one another.

Murray has promoted the RCAF Association and 441 Wing as evidenced by his creation of the 441 Wing Colour Guard. He has organized the Wing's annual Battle of Britain ceremonies, liaising with the City of Barrie and 16 Wing staff. He has avidly preserved the aviation history of the local area by working with the Edenvale Classic Aircraft Foundation (ECAF), and with the Edenvale Aviation Heritage Foundation (EAHF) where he researched the airport's history and is in the process of constructing a diorama of the aerodrome during the 1940's. 9. 82nd Anniversary of the Battle of Britain:

The Battle of Britain Flag Raising is planned to take place at Barrie City Hall on Monday, 12 Sept, 2022 at 1000 hrs. We are also planning to commemorate the 82nd Anniversary of the Battle of Britain with a ceremony in Barrie's Military Heritage Park on Sunday, 18 Sept 2022. The ceremony is being organized by Murray Conley and will feature the Wing Colour Guard consisting of Murray, Randy Rice, Les Ball, Andrew Galton, and Wally Capsticks along with participation by military personnel from 16 Wing, the RCL #147 Barrie, and local Cadet organizations. If you are available, please plan on coming out to attend one or the other commemorations of this pivotal air battle of the Second World War.

10. Annual Memorial Service for AC1 Stanley Peacock – 13 Oct 2021:

On Thursday, 13 October, 2022, Royal Canadian (Air) Cadet AC1 Stanley Peacock will be honoured at a wreath laying ceremony at his grave in St. James' Cemetery, Orillia. AC1 Peacock was killed while building a Fairmile Motor Torpedo Boat at the Orillia shipyard on 13 Oct 1943. The annual

commemoration was initiated by Raywin Raaflaub, a boyhood friend of Stanley Peacock's in 99 RCAC Sqn, Orillia. Special guests in attendance will be Councillors of the City of Orillia, representatives of the OPP; Orillia Fire Dept; Mr. Richard Purcell, RCL Branch #34 Orillia President, and Ms. Deanna Peacock, a relative of Stanley's.

This moving ceremony will include the 441 Wing Colour Party. The service will consist of the traditional Last Post, minute of silence, the Rouse, the Act of Remembrance, the reading of "High Flight", the laying of a wreath in memory of AC1 Peacock and a Closing Prayer by 441 Wing Padre Doug Crocker.

11. <u>TIME CAPSULE: "A Short History of 441 Silver Fox Squadron":</u> By Randolf Rice

The Cold War spanned the period 1945 -1991. During that time RCAF and Air Command squadrons came and went. One of those squadrons was 441 "Silver Fox" Squadron. Soon to be a unit of NORAD and a significant tool in the defence of North America.

On June 26, 1987, NORAD'S newest squadron was officially reactivated as a CF-18 squadron at CFB Cold Lake. 441 Tactical Fighter Squadron had returned to Canada, flying CF-18's after more than 30 years serving with NATO in Europe. The Squadron had been deactivated in March 1986 at CFB Baden-Soelingen with the phase-out of the CF-104.

The Squadron based at CFB Cold Lake dedicated two aircraft on full-time alert at CFB Comox B.C., its deployed operating base.





LGen Donald McNaughton, NORAD'S Deputy Commander-in-Chief (DCINC) stated at 441's activation, "It will help us fill in the gap between two squadrons from Tacoma and Alaska".

For LCol Ian Struthers, Commanding Officer of 441 Sqn and a member of the squadron in its CF-104 days, the time ahead was one of challenges and

excitement. It involves taking 203 personnel-including 20 pilots and turning them into an operationally ready squadron.

In addition to the presence of 410 Operation Training Squadron, already based in Cold Lake, 441 Squadron provided additional punch to North America's first line of defence, in addition to 416 Sqn which would also be stationed there. Current time frame: In recent weeks much emphasis has been directed to strengthening the first line of defence and how significant this continues to be.

As of this date personnel of NORAD continue to provide for our security at a time when it is needed more than ever. Yet their service continues to be unacknowledged by our government's honours and awards system by not awarding a 'NORAD bar' to the Special Service Medal similar to what is done for service in NATO.

<u>Author's Note</u>: A member of our Wing, LCol (ret'd) Billie Flynn, was a former Commanding Officer of 441 "Silver Fox" Squadron in the 1990s.

12. Second World War's Maple Leaf Club Revival – 10 September, 2022:

On Saturday, 10 September, 2022 a group from St. James' Anglican Church, Orillia are recreating the Second World War's "Maple Leaf Club" at their church. The Maple Leaf Club was a place where Airmen and Airwomen, Soldiers, and Sailors could relax and enjoy something to eat, read a book, write letters, or on occasion watch a movie or participate in a dance. This event will run from 1900 -2100 hrs at St. James' Anglican Church, 58 Peter St N, Orillia. It will feature the "Orillia Big Band" who will perform a concert and provide music to dance to. Tickets are \$30.00 each and proceeds from the event will go to benefit the Sharing Place and the Loonie Lunch Food programs.



13. RCAF Association Biennial General Meeting – 14 – 16 October 2022:

This is an update on the upcoming General Meeting in Hamilton, 14 to 16 October 2022, at the Courtyard by Marriott on Upper James Street.

As of 2 September only 13 registrations have been received, including four (4) directors (RCAF A level) and four (4) directors (Wing level) from 441, 410, 447 and 700 Wings. Of the four RCAF A level directors only three (3) are Group level directors also (Ontario, Atlantic and Quebec). We understand RCAF Association representatives from Pacific Region and Alberta Group plan to participate virtually, however.

Any member planning to participate virtually (on-line) may do so (at no cost from the RCAF Association) but you must also register with the association (accounts@airforce.ca or director@airforce.ca) to confirm your intention.

If a Group-level director plans to participate virtually, and has made local audio-visual arrangements for venue and equipment for the benefit of Wing leaders in their regions, they are expected to inform the association (accounts@airforce.ca or director@airforce.ca) of the details, including the names and affiliations of those participating at the local level.

Finally, directors at the RCAF Association level who also serve as directors at the regional level (formerly Group Presidents) are obligated to reach out to all of the Wing leaders in their regions to learn what their intentions are. Again, we only know of the intentions of leaders from just four (4) Wings, meaning upwards of another 50 Wings have yet to reply to the BGM invitations issued in early July. Group Chairpersons (presidents) are kindly requested to forward to the association (accounts@airforce.ca or director@airforce.ca) the list of Wing numbers, along with the names and e-mail addresses of Wing Chairpersons (presidents) and their intentions to participate 'in-person', or 'virtually', or 'not participating in any form.'

Your immediate response to this request will help the Board of Directors decide on the viability and feasibility of continuing to organize for this event. Circumstances may be such that a down-scaling of the event may be in order, details of which can certainly be shared with the membership after we learn more about the level of anticipated participation.
