April 27, 2008 - Port Albany, Ontario

The local residents of Port Albany, a community in Northern Ontario board a Cormorant Helicopter during an evacuation from the area due to the threat of flooding. The Cormorant Helicopter based at 9 Wing Gander piloted by Lieutenant Colonel (LCol) Gilbert Thibault and Captain (Capt) Scott Tromp from 413 Squadron, Canadian Forces Base (CFB) Greenwood was one of many aircraft assisting in the evacuation. The Canadian Forces military deplolyed six Griffon Helicopters from various bases, a Sea King Helicopter from 12 Wing Shearwater, a Cormorant Helicopter from 9 Wing Gander, and a Hercules CC-130324 from 8 Wing Trenton assisted in the evacuation of the residents, transferring them from Port Albany to Moosonee, Ontario.

CT-155 Hawk Crashes At 15 Wing

15 Wing Moose Jaw, Sask. – A CT-155 Hawk aircraft, on a routine training mission, crashed within the 15 Wing perimeter on April 18 at approximately 4:00 pm.

Pilots, Second-Lieutenant Rock Veilleux, Canadian Air Force, and Major Frank Wagener, German Air Force, ejected safely and were quickly transported to the Moose Jaw Hospital for treatment of non-life threatening injuries.

"The cause of the accident is unknown at this point," stated Acting 15 Wing Commander, LCol Paul Goddard. "A Flight Safety Team has been dispatched from Ottawa... to begin the investigation."

There will be an operational pause with the CT-155 Hawk fleet to ensure there is no additional risk to the fleet.

Flying operations will resume once Wing Operations are satisfied there is no risk to personnel.
