4. <u>Honours and Awards</u>:

Three members of our Wing are proud recipients of the RCAF Association Ontario Group Awards of Merit.

The first recipient is Mrs. Jane Coxon of Stayner, receiving her award for her longstanding support and contributions to 441 Wing's activities. Of note is her 11 years of dedication as the Barrie Scout Liaison Officer to the 3 Barrie Scout troops supported by 441 Wing; 8th Barrie, 1st Holly and 1st Mapleview. Jane also diligently performed the duty of Wing Secretary from 2012 to 2017, a job that she still carries out.

Mr. Bill Blakey received his award in recognition of his years of service and positions held within 441 Wing, but particularly as the Wing President during a period of drastic change. In 2008, due to declining membership the Wing's building, easily identifiable on Hwy 90 by its signature red T-33 Thunderbird aircraft on a pedestal had to be sold. Bill was pivotal in the planning, organizing and preparation of the sale. He remained an active member on the Wing Board of Directors until 2016.

The third Award of Merit was presented to the Board of Directors of Ad Astral Place, a not-for-profit housing complex on the corner of Anne St. and Edgehill Dr. in Barrie with the RCAF ensign and Canadian flag flying proudly in front of it. For the past 31 years Wing members have proudly volunteered on Ad Astral's Board of Directors overseeing it's planning, construction and efficient running right through to today. Comprising the current board is Board Chairperson Gerry Pepplar, assisted by Directors Art Cameron, Jim Purchase, Ray Raaflaub, Mark Tobin, Sherry Tobin-Green and Stan Bieniawski. Initiated in 1987 by members of 441 Wing as a retirement residence for military personnel, the complex is now part of Simcoe County's affordable housing inventory and is managed by Progressive Management and Consulting. Both Simcoe County and Progressive Management have praised the positive and caring contribution made by 441 members through their role in the decision making process whereby the "business side" is balanced by their responsible compassion.

Bill Sergeant, 441 Wing's President, congratulated the recipients on this significant achievement. "Only four Awards of Merit are given each year among all the Wings in Ontario. For 441 Wing's members to be presented with three of the awards recognizes the hard work and positive impact these people have on their community. Well Done!"

Murray Conley and a dedicated team from the Edenvale Aviation Heritage Foundation (EAHF) have been actively lobbying the Toronto City Council in order to obtain the partially restored 'deaccessioned' Lancaster, FM104, from the city of Toronto. Murray and Dave Snedden, a senior AME with the Province of Ontario, had briefed the Commander 16 Wing and his staff on 4 July, 2018 to solicit potential assistance for the restoring the aircraft at Edenvale by the Airmen and Airwomen awaiting training at 16 Wing. Unfortunately, Toronto city council voted to transfer the Toronto-built Lancaster to the British Columbia Aviation Museum (BCAM), rejecting multiple proposals that would have kept the iconic aircraft close to home. The decision came July 24, 2018 and was recently confirmed at a subsequent meeting. FM104 airframe and parts are currently being packaged up and crated in preparation for shipping.

7. Battle of Britain Parade 2018 - Barrie:

Murray Conley is heading up the Wing Committee for the Battle of Britain Parade 2018 at Barrie's Cenotaph, Memorial Square, to honour the sacrifices made by those in military service, past and present. He is doing this in conjunction with 16 Wing, Borden. We would like to have as large a turn out from 441 Wing as possible, so please let Andy Galton know if you can be there. Andy, Murray and Janet Forrester will be sending out invitations for those wishing to be seated for the ceremony. As well, the Battle of Britain flag raising will take place at the City Hall Flag poles at 1100 hrs on Monday, 10 September, 2018. Come out and join us if you can.

Five years ago, the Library and Archives Canada committed to digitizing all of the Canadian Expeditionary Force service files. It took them 18 months to prepare all 622,290 files for digitization alone! They are pleased to announce that the project is now 100% complete, and you can access all of the files online for free. With the end of the project, over 30 million images have been digitized, which resulted in over 540 terabytes of data. 12. <u>Remembering Flight Lieutenant George Mitchell:</u> By Norm Marion, RCAF 441 (Huronia) Wing

On July 5, 2018, the Royal Canadian Air Force lost one of its long-time supporters in the Borden-Barrie community. Flight Lieutenant (Ret'd) George Mitchell, a former member of RCAF 441 (Huronia) Wing, passed away peacefully in his 95th year.

Originally from Great Britain, George Mitchell was a pilot during the Second World War. He joined the RAF in 1942 and came to 32 Service Flying Training School in Moose Jaw, Sask., to train as a pilot under the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan. After earning his pilot wings, he returned overseas to train on bombers and eventually served on 9 Squadron RAF. He was injured on his very first operational sortie when a Lancaster bomber exploded upon take-off, right in front of his own aircraft. He later served with 428 Squadron RCAF, the "Ghost Squadron", as a bomber instructor. After the war, he came to Canada (he had married his wife Virginia, whom he had met during his BCATP stay in Canada, in 1945) and found employment as an engineer with Avro Canada, where he continued to work until the cancellation of the Avro Arrow project in 1959. He entered the Ontario Secondary

School programme as a teacher and worked in that capacity until his retirement in 1989.

Throughout his career, George remained committed to Veterans organisations such as the RCAF Association and the Air Crew Association. He served as president of RCAF 441 (Huronia) Wing in the early 2000s, and was involved in many aspects of RCAF anniversary celebrations and other Air Force related commemorations in the Borden-Barrie area throughout the '90s and 2000s. He represented the Canadian chapter of the Battle of Britain Historical Society at the 2005 unveiling of the famous London monument commemorating the Battle of Britain, and was part of a group of Veterans that attended the unveiling of the Bomber Command Memorial by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in 2012. George was awarded the Knight's Cross of the Legion of Merit by the French Government in 2015.

Locally, George's efforts were recognized by 16 Wing Borden with a Wing Commander's Commendation in 2004. "Mr. George Mitchell distinguished himself through his ardent support to the Air Force, the Air Annex to the Base Borden Military Museum and local Air Cadet Squadrons", reads the citation. "Tireless and most dedicated, Mr. Mitchell has fully committed himself to supporting the Wing in its goal of fostering close ties with the local community, most especially the Air Force Association of Canada. His leadership and countless volunteer hours freely given to the development and evolution of the Base Borden Military Museum Air Annex and local Air Cadet Squadrons are sterling examples to others." George was also made a member of the 16 Wing Fellowship in 2010, one of the "original 12" members. George's ashes will be scattered at the RCAF Cairn on Maple Leaf Drive at 16 Wing, CFB Borden at 1050 hrs. If you are available, you are invited to attend in full dress uniform with medals.


